RE: Proposed Sign Regulations

My suggestions are as follows:

Create the proposal based on clear cut goals of supporting and encouraging business growth.

These regulations balance the need to protect the public safety and welfare, the need for a well maintained and attractive community, and the need for adequate identification, communication and advertising. The regulations for signs have the following specific objectives:

- A. To protect the rights of businesses in regards to signage.
- B. To ensure that signs are designed, constructed, installed and maintained according to minimum standards to safeguard life, health, property, and public welfare;
- C. To allow and promote positive business climate.
- D. To reflect and support the desired ambience and development patterns of the various zoning districts, overlay districts, planning areas, and sub-areas and promote an attractive environment;
- E. To allow for adequate and effective signs whose dimensional characteristics further the interests of public safety and the needs of the motorist, where signs are viewed from a street or roadway; and
- F. To ensure that the constitutionally guaranteed right of free expression is protected.

Remove ALL unnecessary, repetitive language and clutter

Reformat for ease of use by business owners not county staff

Only include each Town Centers additional general requirements rather than repeat default regulations

Banners - No restrictions up to 30 days

Temporary Signs - Allowable Friday evenings through Sunday night

Lighted Signs - Allow illumination

Message/Sandwich Boards - No restrictions

Window Signs - No restrictions

Use of Vehicle as Signage - No restrictions
