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## PREFACE

This publication contains the Calvert County Electrical Code and the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Electrical Examiners and Supervisors for Calvert County, Maryland

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## SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

It is the intention of the Board that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of the Code and Rules and Regulations are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of the Code or Rules and Regulations is declared unconstitutional or invalid, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of these Rules and Regulations and Code.

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## SECTION I

### ELECTRICAL CODE

**A. PURPOSE AND SCOPE**

The purpose and scope of this code are the same as that of the National Electrical Code, as amended, which sets standards for and provides for the inspection of, inspection procedures, permit requirements of the installation, alteration, repair, servicing, and maintenance of electrical wiring and equipment and interpretation of the Electrical Code.

**B. ADOPTION OF CODE**

The Board hereby adopts the ~~current~~ 2011 National Electrical Code, as amended, as the Electrical Code for Calvert County, Maryland unless the provisions of these rules and regulations or the code as amended herein differ from the National Electrical Code, in which case the rules and regulations and the code as amended herein shall apply and govern.

**C. DEFINITIONS**

The definitions as adopted in the rules and regulations shall apply to the Calvert County Electrical Code unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

**D. ENFORCEMENT**

The second sentence of Section 90-4 of the National Electrical Code is deleted and the following is substituted in place thereof: The authority having jurisdiction of enforcement of this code and the rules and regulations promulgated there under shall be the Board. Said Board shall have the responsibility for making interpretations of the code and rules, for deciding upon the approval of equipment and materials, and for granting the special permission contemplated in the code and rules and regulations.

**E. INTERPRETATIONS**

The inspection authority shall have the authority to interpret the code in field situations. Any disputed interpretations of the code or its rules and regulations may be appealed to the Board in writing and the Board shall hold a special meeting within four (4) working days of the receipt of the appeal.

**F. OTHER AMENDMENTS AND SUPPLEMENTS TO THE CODE**

1. No person shall perform or start any electrical work covered by the code unless all licenses, permits and inspection requirements have been complied with.
2. It shall be unlawful for any person to install, alter, maintain, service or repair electrical equipment in or on any building, structure or part thereof or any premises, which does not conform to the code and rules and regulations promulgated there under.
3. Master electricians shall be responsible only for work done by them or their agents or employees.
4. No repairs or additions to existing installations shall be made unless the service is adequate to safely carry the existing and additional load. Additions to all types of electrical work regardless of occupancy are to be inspected by process of an application being submitted to the inspection authority for this County.

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5. No electrical work shall be done without first obtaining a permit from the inspection authority unless specifically exempted from permit requirements elsewhere in this code.
- a. All electrical work as outlined in the preceding paragraph which requires a permit must be reported by application to the inspection authority at least twenty-four hours prior to commencing work.
  - b. All permit applications must be signed by the Master electrician obtaining the permit.
  - c. All permit application must include a description of work and include equipment and device counts.
  - d. All permit application for other than single family dwelling installations shall include electrical plans.
    - i. Plans shall include the physical address of the work location, the total square footage, an electrical power plan, an electrical lighting plan, light fixture schedule, electrical one-line riser diagram, panel schedule and rating with demand loads and total service demand load.
    - ii. Submitted plans shall be legible and a minimum of 8 1/2" x 10".
    - iii. Submitted plans shall be stamped and signed by a Professional Engineer registered with the State of Maryland.
      - a. This requirement may be waived at the discretion of the Board.
  - e. Review and approval of submitted plans and permit application shall not relieve the applicant of the responsibility of compliance with this Code.

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6. Permit Fees: Permit fees shall be paid in accordance with the schedule of fees as established by the Calvert County Board of County Commissioners. The inspection authority shall have the right to waive fees subject to approval of the Board of County Commissioners.

7. Additional Permit Fees: Additional permit fees shall be required on all one-time inspection jobs that require additional inspections. Also, additional fees will be required if more than one inspection is required on any violation notice and for special inspections required for the investigation of any violations. ~~The additional-~~Additional fees shall be required in accordance with the schedule of fees for any and all work performed that was not reported on the original application.

~~8. Any inspection to be made on electrical work which is to be concealed shall be made or attempted to be made by the inspection authority within two (2) working days beginning the day after such inspection is requested to be made. If the inspection is not made within the time period aforesaid, a second notice shall be given to the inspection authority. No electrical work can be concealed within four (4) working hours after this second notice to the inspection authority.~~

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~~9.8. No licensee shall commence work on another licensee's work unless the original licensee has withdrawn or has been removed from such work. A letter of explanation from the homeowner/contractor and/or the licensee shall be sent to the Board explaining the circumstances of the case.~~

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~~10.9. Under normal circumstances there can be only one (1) electrical permit for electrical work on a given jobsite except for the wiring of different systems (i.e. security, sound, elevators, etc.) which require separate permits.~~

~~44-10.~~ Any permit issued shall become invalid if the authorized work is not started within ~~six (6)~~ **twenty-four (24)** months from the date of issuance of the permit or if the authorized work is suspended or abandoned for a period of ~~six (6)~~ **twelve (12)** months. The Board shall have the authority to cancel, suspend or revoke any permit, after a hearing by the Board, at which time the licensee shall be afforded the opportunity to be present.

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~~42-11.~~ Whenever there is an emergency disconnect and the master electrician is unable to contact the inspection authority, a master electrician shall have the authority to notify the local power company when there is a breakdown of service and to make emergency repairs for the reconnection of service. The master electrician shall secure a permit on the next working day.

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~~43-12.~~ It shall be unlawful for any owner, agent or tenant of any building, lot or premises or any other persons to knowingly employ any person to do electrical work unless such person so employed has in his possession the necessary license that is required by this Board.

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~~44-13.~~ When any electrical wiring or equipment is found upon inspection by the inspection authority to violate the code, the person responsible for the electrical wiring and equipment shall be notified in writing and shall make any changes or repairs necessary to comply with this code. If any person fails to comply with a notice issued by the inspection authority to correct a violation of the code within thirty (30) days or any other period that may be specified, after receipt of such notice, the inspection authority may notify the power company supplying the electricity of such violations. In such cases, the notice to the power company shall state the reason for the service being disconnected and copies of the notice shall be sent to the owner or occupant of the premises and the party responsible for the violation, if such party be known. If the owner is unknown, notice may be sent to owner as shown on the records of the Department of Assessments and Taxation at such address as is shown in the records of the Assessment Department. If a licensed electrician fails to make corrections of a violation within the time specified in the notice, they shall be refused any further permits to do electrical work within Calvert County until such corrections are made. If such party is not a licensed electrician, that party shall be prosecuted as well as being subject to other sanctions as deemed proper by the Board.

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~~45-14.~~ The inspection authority shall have the authority to stop any job being performed that has no electrical permit. Also, the authority shall stop any person from performing electrical work who does not have in their possession an electrical license issued by the Board of Electrical Examiners and Supervisors for Calvert County, Maryland.

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~~46-15.~~ In the event that a holder of a master class license employed by a Company, Firm, Partnership or Corporation or any other entity severs their connection with such Company, Firm, Partnership, Corporation or entity, it shall be the duty of both the licensee and the entity in question to notify the Board and inspection authority within thirty (30) days.

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~~47-16.~~ A Master electrician shall have at least one (1) Journeyman licensed in Calvert County on the job at all times if he (the master) cannot be present.

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~~48-17.~~ The Master electrician will be required to meet the electrical inspector on the job site for any re-inspection of swimming pool electrical installation including all bonding required for steel, deck, fence, ladder, etc.

~~18-19.~~ Bond wires for swimming pools in Calvert County shall be a continuous unbroken line between all metal parts. Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

19. Metal wire mesh located within 5' of swimming pools shall be bonded to each other by a split-bolt type connector. The split-bolt type connector shall be listed for use for swimming pools and shall be made of stainless steel, brass or copper.

~~20-21.~~ The smallest sized electrical service to be installed for any dwelling is to be one hundred amperes. Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

~~24-24.~~ All modular homes entering Calvert County shall have a Maryland State approved electrical certificate and seal. Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

~~22-25.~~ No aluminum conductors smaller than number six (6) A.W.G. shall be installed in any installation in Calvert County. This includes copper clad aluminum conductors. Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

~~23-27.~~ The use of armored cable shall be restricted to dry installations or normally dry areas only. Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

~~24-26.~~ No electric wiring or equipment shall be installed in a ~~dwelling structure~~ until the dwelling structure is weather tight (all windows and doors, skylights, roof shingles and subsiding). Leniency should be given only to door openings 48" or smaller and garage doors. Final decision should be made by the inspector in the field. Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

~~25-29.~~ No underground installations shall be covered until the inspection authority has inspected and approved same. Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

~~26-30.~~ All hot water heaters in Calvert County shall have a cutoff switch if the panel is not within ~~sight of the water heater or within 50 feet~~ disconnecting means within sight and shall be within 50 feet of the hot water heater. Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

~~27-23.~~ The Board approved the use of two (2) 8-ft. ground rods on all electrical services except for temporary pole services. Grounding is to be connected together either at the panels or the grounds rods. Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

~~28-22.~~ Electric services for residential dwellings having an electric furnace or furnaces of 20 kw or larger shall have at least a 300-amp service. Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

~~29-20.~~ Split bus panels will not be acceptable for use as service equipment in Calvert County. Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

~~30-31.~~ Lights installed in crawl spaces shall not be ~~connected to the load side of the GFI receptacle in that crawl space~~ GFCI protected. Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

~~31-28.~~ Any area of a dwelling that meets the criteria of a habitable room, according to the Calvert County Building Code, is to be wired accordingly. Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

~~32.~~ ~~In residential dwellings no smoke detectors or lighting outlets shall be on an arc fault circuit.~~ Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

~~33-32.~~ Bath All receptacles shall be a minimum of 30" horizontally from the tub or shower space. Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

~~34-38.~~ Article 555.1 (Marinas and Boatyards) delete the second paragraph and add - this article shall apply to residential piers also. Formatted: Bullets and Numbering

39. Article 555.17(b) (Disconnecting Means for Shore Power Connections – Location) the location of the disconnecting means shall be within site of the shore power outlet for residential piers only.

~~36-34. Article 410.66 2(b)~~ (Luminaries Lighting fixtures, Lampholders and Lamps – Installation)  
All recessed fixtures installed in ceilings with insulation shall be  
(i) Types IC rated or the equivalent.

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33. Microwaves shall be connected to a 20 amp dedicated circuit. This circuit shall serve no other outlets.

37. In other than dwelling units equipment operating at 200 volts phase to phase or greater installed on platforms, balconies, or mezzanine floors or in attic or roof rooms or spaces shall be readily accessible.

35. Fire-stats (high temperature cut off switch) shall be installed for attic fans.

36. Smoke detectors and Carbon monoxide detectors shall be located at least 3 feet away from HVAC supply and return vents.

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**SECTION II**

**RULES AND REGULATIONS**

**A. PURPOSE AND SCOPE**

The rules and regulations provide for the licensing of all persons involved in the installation, alteration, repair, servicing and maintenance of electrical wiring and equipment and the interpretation of the Electrical Code.

**B. DEFINITIONS**

The following words shall have the meanings indicated unless the context clearly requires otherwise:

1. Board – The State of Maryland Board of Electrical Examiners and Supervisors for Calvert County, Maryland.
2. Electrical code or code – the National Electrical Code as amended by the National Fire Protection Association or any other electrical code adopted by this Board.
3. Inspection authority – the Department of Inspections and Permits of Calvert County, Maryland.
4. Related business – a firm that performs electrical work.
5. Master Electrician – all persons who have completed four (4) years of apprentice training plus three (3) years as a journeyman electrician and by reason of practical experience and a reasonable knowledge of the natural laws of electricity and the functions of electrical conductors, appliances and devices, are qualified to engage in the trade or business of installing, erecting or repairing any and all manner, type or description of electrical conductors, appliances or devices for the utilization of electrical current in the production of light, heat or power.
6. Restricted Electrician – all persons who are qualified only to repair or to provide maintenance service to the electrical components of specific devices, which utilize electrical current for their operation. A Restricted Electrician shall be limited to performing electrical repair and maintenance work upon a specific type of device and the circuit pertaining to that specific device. Such licensee shall not be privileged to perform electrical wiring unless a fuse holder for the specific device is available in the main electrical service or provided for by a master electrician. Under no conditions shall such licensee connect the specific device if an overload will develop in the main electrical service.
7. Low Voltage Electrician – Emergency signaling systems – means all persons who, by reasonable practical experience and a reasonable knowledge are qualified to engage in the trade or business of installing, erecting or repairing emergency signaling systems including, but not limited to the following: fire detection and alarms, fire sprinkler, water flow alarms, burglar alarm systems, security alarm, detection systems, telephone communication, cable television and sound systems.
8. Journeyman Electrician – all persons who have completed four (4) years of apprentice training and have proved by reason of practical experience and a reasonable knowledge of natural laws of electricity and the functions of electrical conductors, appliances and

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devices, are qualified to engage in the trade or business of installing, erecting or repairing any and all manner, type or description of electrical conductors, appliances or devices for the utilization of electrical current in the production of light, heat or power, under the supervision of a Master Electrician.

9. Homeowner – A homeowner may wire their own residential property ONLY if they will be residing in the home. They must complete a Calvert County Homeowners examination application, pay the necessary fees and receive a passing grade on the examination. If the homeowner receives a passing grade on the examination, he may apply for a permit from the Calvert County Inspections and Permits Division for the wiring in his house not including the electrical service. A Master Electrician with a Calvert County Master license must install the electrical service. Once the homeowner receives the final inspection for the permit to wire his residential property any additional wiring after that time must be done by a Calvert County licensed Master Electrician. The application fee for the homeowner's examination is \$10.00. This is a one-time authorization for electrical installation at the applicant's permanent residence.

### C. LICENSES

1. Classes – The following licenses will be issued:
  - a. Master Electrician
  - b. Inactive Master Electrician
  - c. Restricted Master Electrician
  - d. Inactive Restricted Master Electrician
  - e. Low Voltage Electrician
  - f. Inactive Low Voltage Electrician
  - g. Journeyman Electrician
  - h. Apprentice Electrician
2. Application
  - a. Any person desiring to secure a license that is required by these Rules and Regulations shall make written application therefore, to the Board, on forms provided by the Board. All questions on such application forms shall be answered by the applicant in full and the information requested on forms shall be furnished by the applicant under oath to the best of their knowledge, information and belief. False, erroneous or misleading answers, statements or information furnished by the applicant on said forms will be the cause for rejection of their application or the revocation of any license issued thereunder.
  - b. A written examination will be required of all license applicants except those applicants for Apprentice licenses, Reciprocal or State licensed applicants.
    - (1) All applicants applying for a license by reciprocity will need to have a letter from the licensing Board where they received their license by written examination and a letter from the Inspection Authority showing them in good standing with no outstanding violations. They will also need to have a Certificate of Insurance for Master, Restricted Master and Low Voltage license.
    - (2) All applicants applying for Master class license in Calvert County with a Maryland State License need only show proof of an active and current State License and a Certificate of Insurance.
  - c. Before examination, inquiry shall be made by the Board concerning the personal character, education, experience and practical knowledge of electricity of the

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applicant, the results of which shall become the property of the Board. If, in the opinion of the Board, the results of said inquiry do not entitle the applicant to examination for or to the license for which they applied, the applicant shall be notified in writing of the Board's refusal to grant examination and/or a license, directed to the address of the applicant as shown on their current application.

- d. All applications for Master and Restricted Master examinations must be accompanied by a non-refundable fee of ~~fifteen dollars (\$15.00)~~ fifty dollars (\$50.00). Applications for Low Voltage and Journeyman examinations must be accompanied with a non-refundable fee of ~~ten dollars (\$10.00)~~ twenty-five dollars \$25.00.
- e. Applicants for all Master Class Licenses must be least twenty-one (21) years of age.
- f. All applicants shall appear in persons.

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### 3. Examination

- a. Examinations shall be held four (4) times each calendar year on the last Saturday of January, April, July and October with at least two (2) Board members present.
- b. All applicants must have their applications on file with the Board at least thirty (30) days prior to the next scheduled written examination before being permitted to take said written examination or being reviewed for license.
- c. The Board shall notify each applicant within the period of ten (10) days that it has received their application for examination. If the applicant fails to take their examination when scheduled by the Board, an additional application and application fee will be required.
- d. The written examination for all classes of licenses shall be predicated upon the standards of the National Electrical Code and the Calvert County Code as well as the natural laws of electricity and the Rules and Regulations adopted by the Board.
- e. An applicant seeking permission to take the written examination for the Master electrician must:
  - (1) have been continuously engaged as their primary occupation during the three (3) years immediately proceeding the date of their application as a Journeyman or seven (7) years total in the electrical trade under the supervision of a Master Electrician, or
  - (2) have successfully completed a formal study and had training in electrical installations at a trade school or other educational institution; consideration will be given, if in the opinion of the Board, such education and training should have provided you with the knowledge and skill required of a Master Electrician.
- f. In order to qualify for Master, Restricted Master, Low Voltage or Journeyman licenses being granted the applicant must receive a grade constituting, at least, seventy percent (70%) of the total possible point credits in the examination or its equivalent as graded by at least two (2) Board members.

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- g. Each applicant who has taken a written examination shall be notified as soon as practical thereafter of the pass/fail grade, which they received in such examination. Each applicant who has received a passing grade shall be notified that upon their payment, within thirty (30) days, of the appropriate license fee to the Board, they shall be issued the license for which they were examined.
  - h. The use of any unauthorized material or other misbehavior of the applicant during their examination shall cause the immediate rejection of their application and bar them from re-examination for a period of six (6) months. Any such rejection shall be permanently noted in the minutes of the Board.
  - i. All applicants granted permission to take the Master, Restricted Master, Low Voltage or Homeowners examination shall pay the Board a fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and all persons granted permission to take examination for Journeyman shall pay the Board a fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) prior to commencing the examination.
4. Re-Examination Procedures
- a. Persons who have failed the written examination for any class license shall not be entitled to re-examination until the following periods have elapsed from the date of the preceding examination:
    - (1) After the first examination, not less than three (3) months.
    - (2) After the second examination, not less than six (6) months.
    - (3) After the third examination, not less than twelve (12) months.
    - (4) All examinations thereafter, not less than twelve (12) months.
  - b. The above periods shall not apply when the re-examination is ordered by the panel of arbitration.
5. Insurance Certificates
- a. An applicant who has successfully passed an examination for a Master, Restricted Master or Low Voltage class electricians license shall pay the required fee and provide the required insurance certificate within thirty (30) days after completion of such examination. An applicant who has successfully passed the required examination for a master class license, but does not want to engage in the related business does not have to post the required insurance, but must abide by all of the rules and regulations for Calvert County. Said applicant shall be placed on the inactive list until the required insurance is posted. Insurance in the amount of \$300,000 liability to \$100,000 property damage.
  - b. The applicant for issuance of a master class license or renewal of the same will be required to submit a copy of their current liability insurance coverage of at least \$300,000/100,000 and list Calvert County Board of Electrical Examiners and Supervisors as the certificate holder.
6. License Renewals
- a. All licenses expire on June 30 in each even-numbered year and are renewable every two (2) years on payment of the appropriate renewal fees prior to July 1. Failure to renew the electrical license prior to July 1 shall cause the license to

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expire. After July 1, a firm or corporation may not engage or offer to engage, or hold themselves out as engaging as a Master Electrician under a license unless the license is restored or reissued.

- b. If application for restoration is made within ninety (90) days after June 30, a license, which expires because of failure to renew prior to July 1, shall be restored only on payment of the renewal fee and a restoration fee of \$50.00. If the application for restoration is not made within the ninety (90) day period after expiration, a renewal may not be issued and the Board may require compliance by examination, before reissuance of a license, as if the applicant had never been licensed.

#### 7. Fees

- a. The fees for the classes of license shall be as follows:

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### 8. Suspension and Revocation

- a. The Board shall have full power to suspend or revoke for proper cause any license or renewal thereof issued under these rules and regulations after a public hearing of all parties of interest. At least fourteen (14) days prior to such a public hearing the Board, by certified mail, shall notify the licensee charged with the violation, of the hour, date and place of the public hearing. At such hearing, the licensee shall have the right to be represented by counsel of their own choice who may examine and cross-examine all witnesses testifying before the Board and who may call witnesses on behalf of the licensee. Should the licensee desire a transcript of the proceedings, they shall furnish a stenographer approved by the Board. The licensee shall pay their counsel as well as the stenographer. All witnesses shall testify under oath and the chairman of the meeting shall administer the oath unless the chairman shall designate another member of the Board to administer the oath. Upon conclusion of the proceedings, the Board shall render its decision no later than the second regular meeting of the Board following the conclusion of the hearing. If the Board revokes or suspends the license, the licensee shall immediately surrender their license. In its discretion, the Board may issue a written warning to the licensee or may grant leave to the licensee to rectify the violation within a specifically limited time.
- b. Proper cause for suspension or revocation of licenses shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
  - (1) Performing or permitting the performance of dangerous work or defective work.
  - (2) Failure to provide required insurance certificate.
  - (3) Violation of the code or any rules or regulation.
  - (4) Permitting an unlicensed person to utilize the licensee's license in order to secure certification from the inspection authority.
  - (5) Failure for more than thirty (30) days to correct a violation of the code after having been notified by the inspection authority of such violation.
- c. In the event that the Board determines that the license shall not be revoked, but issues a written warning to the licensee, such warning shall become a part of the permanent records of the Board and shall be considered by the Board in its determination in the event of future violations by the licensee.

### 9. Enforcement

- a. Complaints from licensees, applicants, the inspection authority or those aggrieved by the actions of a licensee shall be made in writing to the Board.
- b. The Board will examine all violation certificates reported by the inspection authority to have been outstanding for a period of thirty (30) days or more against licensees. Where, in the opinion of the Board, there does not exist good cause for the violation remaining uncorrected, the defaulting licensee will be summoned to show cause why their license should not be suspended, revoked or cancelled. The licensee will be questioned at a hearing on the matter and the licensee will be given the opportunity to present in detail an explanation of the alleged default.

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- c. Any person who shall violate the code or these rules and regulations, whether that person is licensed or not, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars nor more than five hundred (\$500.00) dollars, or to an imprisonment not exceeding ninety (90) days, or both, at the discretion of the court. In the event of any such conviction by a licensee, the Board may convene a hearing for the purpose of determining the appropriate action to be taken on said licensee which may include suspension or revocation. Said hearing shall be subject to the same rules and restrictions as set forth elsewhere in the rules and regulations in regard to hearings for suspension or revocation of a license.
10. Forms
- a. No application, insurance certificate or other documents for which the Board has adopted a form shall be considered unless the same is submitted on such approved form.
11. Other License Regulations
- a. Licensees are required to notify the Board, in writing, within thirty (30) days of any change in their address as shown on the application for said license or renewal thereof.
  - b. The license granted under these Rules and Regulations for Master Class Electricians licenses - active, shall be conspicuously displayed in the office or place of business of the licensee and the holder of every Master Class License shall display in a conspicuously place on the vehicle used in the performance of their business, a sign at least sixteen by twelve inches (16" x 12"), containing their name, business name and telephone number, all of which shall be displayed on their vehicles while in the performance of said business.
  - c. No Master, Restricted Master, Low Voltage or Journeyman Class Electrician licensed in Calvert County shall act as representative under more than one license.
  - d. A licensee with a Master Class license shall not transfer their license more than one (1) time during a twelve (12) month period.
